Call for Papers

The Harvard Department of Celtic Languages & Literatures cordially invites proposals for papers on topics which relate directly to Celtic Studies or Celtic languages and literatures in any phase, and papers on relevant cultural, historical or social science topics, theoretical perspectives, etc. for the 41st annual Harvard Celtic Colloquium. Papers concerning interdisciplinary research with a Celtic focus are also invited.

The Colloquium will take place at Harvard University on October 7-9, 2022, but arrangements may be made for an on-line or hybrid event if necessary.

The keynote speaker will be Professor Natasha Sumner of Harvard University.

Attendance is free. Presentations should be no longer than twenty minutes, with a short discussion period after each paper. Papers given at the Colloquium may later be submitted for consideration by the editorial committee for publication in the *Proceedings of the Harvard Celtic Colloquium*.

Potential presenters should submit an abstract of 200-250 words and a brief biographical sketch. Submissions should be sent by e-mail to hcc@fas.harvard.edu. Please send submissions in the body of the email or as an attached Word Document.
